philosophical insights. It encourages the study of these artistic forms. It explores and promotes spiritual and mystical traditions within western culture. The academy engages with philosophical and ethical discussions fostering a deeper understanding of the intellectual and moral aspects of the western thought. Its mission is to provide a space for the exploration of the deeper dimensions of western culture and to encourage a meaningful dialogue between the arts, spirituality and philosophy. Moreover, it places a strong emphasis on the inner, spiritual dimensions of human experience. It further commends the importance of spiritual insights and the longing pursuit of wisdom as essential parts of human culture. Raine was actively connected with the academy as she often explored and promoted mystical traditions that were often deeply spiritual in nature, through her writings. She sought to understand and preserve the spiritual wisdom contained within these traditions. As a literary figure she was highly engaged in the study of sacred texts, mythology and spiritual symbols that contain a deeper meaning in these texts and myths. As per the vision of Kathleen Raine, the academy encourages an interdisciplinary approach with spirituality at the core. It also recognises spirituality as an essential component of the human culture encouraging dialogues and discussions on related topics thus promoting a community of individuals who consider spirituality an integral part of human culture and developmental process.
